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LEA Plan for Use Of Funds

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- 1. The extent to which and how the funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are, to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools, in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning; ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

CDC continues to recommend masking and physical distancing as key prevention strategies. When physical distancing is not practical, the use of PPE and the implementation of other prevention strategies is highly recommended. As such, East Rutherford school district seeks to use funding from this grant to purchase PPE and other equipment that will mitigate the spread of the Corona Virus within the school setting. The district seeks to use funds to buy materials such as desk shields for the elementary building. These desk shields will offer a protective barriers for these students who are too young to be vaccinated. The district will use fund to offset the cost of improving ventilation, purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean the facilities, offsetting the cost of inspection, testing, maintenance, repair and replace equipment as needed to improve the indoor air quality. Other equipment that promotes the safety and wellbeing of students and allow for seamless day to day operation for the school building will also be purchased with these funds.

2. Learning loss will be addressed in several ways. The district will purchase educational screening programs to determine the starting point of our students as well as to conduct progress monitoring throughout the school year. The district seeks to hire the services of educational consultants to work with students and teachers in promoting research based academic intervention as well accelerated learning best practices. Additional services will be provided through our After School Academic Intervention Program and our Summer Enrichment Programs.

The District will use funds to address any additional unique needs that may arise and is allowable under this grant.
